Describe a typical day in your life.

I get up at 6:30. Then I have breakfast with my family. After that I take a ride to school by bike or bus. My school starts at 7:55 and ends at 16:00. Back home I play the trumpet for 30 min. Mondays and Wednesday I have volleyball training (17:30 until 19:30). Thursdays and Fridays I have got trumpet lessons with two different teachers (jazz and classic). My family joins for dinner at about 20:00. I go to bed at 22:00.

Why do you think you will be a successful exchange student?

I think I will be a successful exchange stundent because I am very open to new things, people and life styles. Two years ago I went for three weeks to England to learn the English language. There I was also in a host family and I was very happy there. The way of living is a bit different (e.g. food, behaviour) but after some days I got used to it and I enjoyed it. Further, I changed school one year ago. This change did not bring any particular difficulties for me and I settled well in my new class.

What can you tell us about yourself, your personality or your habits that will help us match you with a host family?

I am happy, active, inventive and a trustful person. I am also a family guy, so I love to be with other kids of my age. But also younger or older "siblings" would be fine with me.

What are your goals in life?

At the moment I am not sure what I want to do after school but there are three jobs that I am currently interested in. These are to become a chef, a mechanical engineer or to work in a bank. For me it is not number one priority to get a job where I earn much money. I think it is more important to enjoy the work rather than to work only because of the money. After the year abroad I may also finish the German high school degree and, possibly, I go to university. At one point, I want to have my own family. I am not very religious but if there is the right woman than I want to marry. I hope that I will be happy and content with my live, job and family. The most important thing in live is the family: "People come and go, just the family stays".

What do you think you will miss most during your exchange year? How do you think you will react if you get homesick?

I think I will miss the german food and, of course, my family and friends. I actually don't think that I will get homesick but, if I do, then I will talk with my host family. If it gets very bad I may talk to my "real" family.

Please describe any awards you have received, or any achievements that you are proud of.

I am proud of the many things which I build myself. These are a RC-boat, my RC-car which I made from a kit, a knife, a bottle-rocket and many other things which are shown in my video. I am particularly proud of my old moped, which I bought last year and which I am restoring now with my brother and my dad.

Why do you want to spend a year abroad?

I want to spend a year abroad because I want to see more from the world, get used to another culture and a different way of living. I think having another family in another country is very cool because then you can learn from each other. America is a great and big country and there will be so many questions that my host family could answer me. For example, what do they think about the guns laws and is it there really "the american dream"? Of cause I also want to get better in English. To be away from my family for so long is a bit of a challenge. This will give me the opportunity to become more independent and to take on more responsible for myself. I also want to have time to think about my future.

I hope that I can speak fluently English and that I know what I want to do thereafter. I think I will be more "grown up" and more mature.
