PURPOSE

Did You Know?

High school music students score higher on average 2 points higher on the Standardized Tests. (Price, 2010) In 2001, SAT takers with coursework/experience in music performance scored 57 points higher on the verbal portion of the test and 41 points higher on the math portion than students with no coursework/experience in the arts.



CURRICULUM

The Southside Band program utilizing a yearly curriculum that includes exercises, drills, and ensemble works in addition to the musical literature selected for performance that teach both the national standards of the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) as well as the Alabama Course of Study (ACS). GRADING POLICY

The purpose of the Southside Band's grading policy is to ensure that we operate a program that promotes personal responsibility, musical growth and achievement, and consistency in pursuing these goals. This policy aims to hold all to a higher standard as we work together to continually improve our band's proud tradition of musical and personal excellence.

CATEGORIES & DESCRIPTIONNS

Performances - 50%

Attendance and preparedness at required performances.

Rehearsal & Attendance Grades – 20%

Preparedness, behavior, and attendance at in-class and after-school rehearsals (how the individual in contributing to the ensemble).

Individual Performance Assessments – 20%

Excerpt pass-offs, playing tests, etc.

Materials & Literacy - 10%

Equipment checks (folder, cubby, instrument checks). Short written assignments (journals, self-assessments, reports, note reading assignments).

- *Alternate assignments will not be given in place of missed performances. Excused absences will result in an empty grade, unexcused absences will result in a zero grade.
- **Marching Band students who are absent (excused or unexcused) from the last rehearsal prior to a performance may not march in that show as too much will have been altered; however, students are still required to attend that performance (football game, contest, etc.).

ENSEMBLES

"The PRIDE" is one band program divided into three ensembles with additional opportunities for optional chamber groups and ensembles. Every band member is automatically a member of both the Marching Band and one of the two concert ensembles. All members of the Southside Band are required to be members of both the concert and marching ensembles. Band is a class that does sometimes require after school commitments. Please see each ensemble's description below.

COMMITMENT - DISCIPLINE - TRADITION - EXCELLENCE

"The PRIDE" of Southside Marching Band – After School (Tues, Thurs, & Fri Aug.-Oct.) Matt Weaver & Austin Waits, Directors

The Marching Band is comprised of every band member at Southside High School and a select group of 8th-grade alternates from Rainbow Middle. The Marching Band rehearses during the summer prior to the start of term and after school two days a week with additional rehearsals for percussion and auxiliary members. The Marching Band performs at all varsity football games (including post-season games), marching contests, and at various parades throughout the year. Students must be a member of the Symphonic Band or the Wind Ensemble course to be a member of the Southside Band and "The PRIDE" of Southside Marching Band.

Symphonic Band – 6th Period (Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri) Austin Waits, Conductor

Symphonic Band is one of two band performance ensembles offered at Southside High School. The Southside Symphonic Band is classified as an "Accomplished Level" ensemble in the Alabama Arts Education Course of Study for students with experience equivalent to multiple years of high school study, in grades 9-12. This course is designed to extend students' technical skills and artistry and to provide students with a deeper understanding and appreciation of the study of music. Throughout the four Artistic Processes, students will perform (singing and playing instruments), create, read/write, and listen/respond/evaluate while employing the following concepts: timbre, rhythm, melody, harmony, form, and expression. The skill of connecting is embedded throughout all standards and grade levels. Refer to Appendix F for Essential Questions and Enduring Understandings. Students must be a member of the Symphonic Band or the Wind Ensemble course to be a member of the Southside Band and "The PRIDE" of Southside Marching Band.

Wind Ensemble – 7th Period (Mon, Tues, Wed, Fri) Matt Weaver, Conductor

Wind Ensemble is one of two band performance ensembles offered at Southside High School. The Southside Wind Ensemble is classified as an "Advanced Level" ensemble in the Alabama Arts Education Course of Study for students with experience equivalent to college-level, honors, or AP study in grades 9-12. Students at this level demonstrate concepts and skills to continue the enjoyment of music in community or professional settings. Throughout the four Artistic Processes, students will perform (singing and playing instruments), create, read/write, and listen/respond/evaluate while employing the following concepts: timbre, rhythm, melody, harmony, form, and expression. The skill of connecting is embedded throughout all standards and grade levels. Refer to Appendix F for Essential Questions and Enduring Understandings. Students must be a member of the Symphonic Band or the Wind Ensemble course to be a member of the Southside Band and "The PRIDE" of Southside Marching Band. Membership in the Wind Ensemble is selected from a band class placement audition conducted by the band directors.

Full Band (Flex Band) – 8th Period (Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri)

The 8th-period class is a flex band period in which every member of the band meets together. During football season and the band's marching competition season, this class offers an opportunity for the marching band to rehearse. After football, this class serves as many purposes as a guided group and individual practice, sectional rehearsal, chamber ensembles, jazz band, and other opportunities, which eliminate the need for many after-school time commitments.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Students are required to be at all camps, rehearsals, and performances as outlined by the director/instructors. Students are also expected to be at school. **EVERY CLASS COUNTS** / **EVERY DAY.** Absences are defined as excused and unexcused.

- Students who miss two (2) rehearsals (excused or unexcused) the week of a performance will not be allowed to perform.
- Students who miss one (1) rehearsal the week of a performance may perform at the director's discretion.

Excused Absences

- Excused absences are defined as illness (must include a signed note from a doctor or parent/legal guardian), death in the family, school conflict, or an emergency medical appointment.
- Excuses must be received in advanced or within one school day.
- Students or parents must notify Mr. Weaver of any absence by email regardless of the reason. If no reason is given, or if no communication occurs, the absence will be marked as unexcused.
- Illness or injury that is severe enough to prevent a student from attending and watching rehearsal will be excused; however, if a student is well enough to attend school, they are expected to attend rehearsal.
- Injury does not exclude anyone from rehearsal. Injured members are required to attend rehearsals to watch and to keep up with any materials they may be missing.
- Members who sit out of a rehearsal due to injury must provide a doctor's note explaining the injury and restrictions/precautions.

Attendance at all after-school rehearsals and performances is a graded requirement.

Excessive tardiness or absenteeism to rehearsal is grounds for removal from the program.

Any unexcused absence from a performance is grounds for removal.

You don't come to rehearsal to learn your part, you come to learn how your part fits in with everyone else.

Instrument Requirements & Suggested Brands

As a parent investing in your child's music education, it is crucial to invest in a quality musical instrument. So-called "bargain" instruments, available online or at discount stores, may seem tempting; however, experience has proven repeatedly that these instruments are indeed no "bargain" at all. Most often, the low price is the result of poor craft and lower-quality materials. These instruments usually break more quickly and are difficult, sometimes impossible, to repair. In many cases, they cannot be played in tune, and the quality of the sound they produce is inferior.

It is disheartening to see a child's enthusiasm for music destroyed by an instrument that does not allow them to reach their full potential. A poor-quality instrument also affects the overall sound of the band, tarnishing the experience for all. With these concerns in mind, we provide you with this list of recommended band instrument brands and accessories. Over the years, we have found that these instruments are durable, easy to repair, and will give your child the best opportunity to succeed as a young musician.

If the instrument you are considering is not listed here, ask the seller for the instrument specifications and consult with your child's band director before you rent or buy

Flute: Open holed flute with case and tuning rod

Suggested brand: Yamaha 684 H, Jupiter Di Medici, Altus. *Piccolo - Yamaha YPC62

Clarinet: Wooden clarinet with case & reed holder with at least three reeds *Suggested brand: Buffet E-11 (Intermediate) R-13 (Professional)*

Oboe: Intermediate or professional instrument with case & at least three reeds *Suggested brand: Loree or Fox 400*

Bassoon: Intermediate or professional instrument with case & at least three reeds *Suggested brand: Fox Renard 220 or 222*

Saxophone: Intermediate or pro instrument with case & reed holder with at least three reeds

Suggested brand: Selmer Superaction 80 Series II or III, Yamaha Custom

Trumpet: Intermediate or pro instrument with case, vale oil, and slide grease *Suggested brand: Bach Stadivarius*

Horn: Intermediate or pro instrument with case, vale oil, and slide grease *Suggested brand: Holton 379*

Trombone: Intermediate or pro instrument with case, tuning-slide grease, cold cream and water spray bottle (main slide) *Suggested brand: Bach 42B, BO*

- * **Euphonium:** Intermediate or pro instrument with case, vale oil, and slide grease Suggested brand: Yamaha 321-S or Willson
- * **Tuba:** Intermediate or pro instrument with case, vale oil, and slide grease *Suggested brand: Miraphone 187*

MEMBERSHIP

Membership in "The PRIDE" is a privilege. Students registering for band make a year-round commitment. Students are not allowed to drop band class during the school year. Students who move to our community during the school year are welcome to join band as soon as they are enrolled at Southside High School. Transfer students should contact the band office to arrange a meeting with the directors. In addition, students who have not previously been in band may join with permission from the directors and administration.

Students who discontinue their membership in the Southside Band are eligible to return to the band on a one-year probationary basis. During this term, probationary members will not be considered for student leadership positions.

The band directors and school administration will evaluate students who are removed from the program and who wish to return.

SHS POLICY ON ALCOHOL, DRUGS & TOBACCO

- 1. All SHS and Etowah County Board of Education rules are in effect. Per county policy, all students participating in band must submit to random drug screening.
- 2. Involvement with alcohol, unauthorized/illegal drugs, or tobacco products will result in the loss of all extracurricular involvement privileges, or dismissal from the band at the discretion of the director.
- 3. Any student involved with the use or possession of the above substances on a band sponsored trip or activity will be sent home at their parents' expense. They will also face legal action from local law-enforcement authorities.

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

- Students are expected to behave at a higher standard than other students at Southside High.
- Students are expected to be courteous, polite, and respectful at all times to all individuals.
- Students are expected to not talk when being spoken to, and refrain from inappropriate language, profanity, or derogatory comments in person or on social media.
- Students are expected to be present, engaged, and on time to all rehearsals and performances.
- Students are expected to cheer on and support Southside High School and its students, programs, and community at large at all times.
- Students are expected to pay their fees in a timely manner so that our program can be financially sound and operate effectively.

Effort & Manners

FACILITIES

Students of the Southside Band program are expected and required to treat others and themselves with the respect and dignity that they deserve. This means also that we are expected to honor our facilities and homes in similar fashion. All students of the Southside High School Band will treat the band room, offices, auditorium, restrooms, practice fields, stadium, etc. with the utmost care and respect.

- All materials are to be stored properly after every class, rehearsal, event, or performance.
- No personal belonging should be left out for any reason.
- Students are expected to maintain a clean and tidy practice field and dispose of all trash and waste properly.
- No food or drink (other than water) are allowed in the band room or auditorium.
- The directors' office is to be respected at all times. If the door is closed, students will knock, wait to be acknowledged, and be given permission to enter.

UNIFORM CODE

Being a part of The PRIDE means that you are now a member of one of the finest marching bands in the activity and are responsible for continuing our trademark tradition of excellence in performance and appearance.

MARCHING BAND

- 1. The uniform is designed for a specific, consistent image throughout the band. Nothing is to be added to or subtracted from any individual uniform. Though auxiliary members and drum major purchase their own uniforms, they represent Southside High and fall under the purview of the uniform code.
- 2. Hair length on both male and female musicians should not be longer than the collar of the jacket. Hair that is longer that the collar on both male and female musicians should be secured in a ponytail the entire time the student is in uniform, with the only exception being on band picture day. Hair color should always be in accordance with school rules.
- 3. Only stud earrings are permitted. No loops, pins, chains, or any other earrings or piercings are to be worn in uniform. In addition, no bright color makeup should be worn while in uniform.
- 4. Neither the jacket nor pants shall ever be allowed to touch the ground. Pants are either to be worn or on a hanger. The jacket may be worn, hung up or folded correctly and laid upon the shako.
- 5. Shakos should always be carried with the opening of the hat facing down. They should never be used as a bucket to carry flip folders, jackets, etc.
- 7. All members of The PRIDE are to be consistent in their appearance and dress at any given time. For example, only wear the hat if the whole band is supposed to have them on; all jackets are either on or off.

CONCERT ENSEMBLES

- 1. The concert ensemble uniform is black, formal ware (tuxedos and dresses)
- 2. Appropriate undergarments must be worn at all times. No visible underwear straps.
- 3. Tuxedos black socks, black dress shoes, no wrist or facial jewelry
- 4. Dresses black hose, dress black flat shoes, no wrist or facial jewelry. Pearl necklaces provided

HONOR BANDS / ALL-STATE BAND

Students will have the opportunity throughout the year to participate in various honor bands hosted by many universities and the Alabama Bandmasters Association. Please follow the proper procedures to participate in an honor band.

- Honor Bands are announced as they are made known to the directors
- Students wishing to participate in an honor band should contact the directors immediately
- Students will not be recommended for honor bands if they are not in good standing with regards to behavior.
- If selected, students are responsible for completing all relevant paperwork, pay any fee, and communicate with the front office to receive a principal's excuse.
- If selected for the Alabama All-State Band, students are responsible for their own hotel rooms at the official, Conference Hotel. A director will accompany All-State students, but the students and parents are responsible for their own transportation.

PRIVATE LESSONS

Private lessons are the BEST way to get better at your instrument. Lessons are not required, but are HIGHLY encouraged! Students joining the HS band as beginners are expected to take private lessons to "catch-up". Any student interested in taking lessons should contact a director for a complete list of instructors.

ALTERNATES (Marching Band)

The Southside Band, like many other high school and collegiate band programs, maintains an alternate system. This means there are fewer "drill spots" on the field than the current number of members on the roster. Having "holes" in the drill creates a tremendous burden and challenge for every other member and negatively effects our performance. Inevitably, someone will become ill, be injured etc., therefore, it is important to have an alternate system.

- A small, select group of 8th grade students from the RMS Band serve as Alternates
- All members, including alternates, attend every rehearsal and performance of the marching band
- Not every member is guaranteed to perform on the field every week
- 8th-Grade Marchers pay a reduced membership fee to help cover costs associated with uniform cleaning and transportation

FEES AND EXPENSES

Why Do We Pay Fees?

Fees are an unfortunate necessity as the Southside Band is a completely self-sustaining program. It takes approximately \$60,000 per year to run the Southside band program. **The school district does not fund any of this expense**. Membership fees bring in roughly \$30k, which means each year, we need to raise approximately \$30,000 to \$35,000! As an organization, we cannot operate and provide any level of experience/education for our students without a solid financial foundation. Every effort has been made to keep fees as low as possible while still providing the best year-round experience possible.

 - Current 8th grade students will not be able to use MySchoolBucks until they are officially enrolled in SHS during the summer (after summer school has finished)



HELP! This is EXPENSIVE!!!

We get it. Being selected as an auxiliary section member is an honor, but costly. Here are two suggestions that might help you raise the necessary funds.

1. Personal Letter to friends, family, or community groups

- Try writing to ask for financial help. Explain that you have been selected to this group, but need support to make that dream a reality.
- Consider how you will approach each possible donor: in person, with a
 phone call, or by letter. A letter is a great choice for most donors; an email is
 NOT a good choice for most donors. Also, consider what you will ask of
 donors; you could ask for direct support for your fees.

 Remember many people may not be able to donate the full amount of your expenses; however, they may be able to contribute a smaller amount. Five, ten, twenty, or even a hundred dollars will add up quickly.

2. Social Media Calendar

- While state law prohibits the SHS Band from hosting fundraisers specifically
 for items that students keep; we can show you an idea you may want to try
 on your own.
- Some parents in the past have had success in posting a picture of a blank calendar along with a picture of their child to social media and asking for financial support since for the child's activity. The idea is that one picks a date and then sponsors the child with the dollar amount of that date. Baseball parents do this quite frequently.


SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM
